

The 4 C's of Compromise

Finding resolutions to conflicts require relationship skills to help students remain calm and practice being caring and empathetic to another point of view. One tip we teach students to help them work together and come to a compromise during a disagreement or conflict is called the Four C's.



Come Together

When you are in a group and have to work with other people, you first have to come together with a common interest. A common interest means you are all working towards the same goal.



Compromise

Compromise means being flexible and sharing ideas. Listen to what others think, be respectful, and work together to find something everyone likes.



Change

Keeping kids engaged keeps them out of trouble—less downtime means fewer distractions for everyone!



Celebrate

Giving a student a special task makes them feel responsible and involved. When they have a role to focus on, they're more likely to stay engaged and less likely to be disruptive.
